INSTRUMENT OF ACCEPTANCE

WHEREAS, the Protocol to Implement the Third Package of Commitments under the ASEAN Framework Agreement on Services, signed at Banda Seri Begawan on 31 December 2001,

AND WHEREAS, Article 5 provides that the said Protocol shall enter into force upon the deposit of instruments of ratification or acceptance by all signatory governments with the Secretary-General of ASEAN.

NOW THEREFORE, the Government of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, having considered the above mentioned Protocol, accepts the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out all the stipulations therein contained
