Instrument of Ratification

WHEREAS Sri Lanka has become a signatory to the Third Protocol Amending the Treaty of Amity and Cooperation in Southeast Asia (TAC) on the 23rd day of July, 2010 in Hanoi, Viet Nam;

WHEREAS the terms of the said Protocol have been examined and found to be acceptable to the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Gamini Lakshman Peiris, Minister of External Affairs of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka do hereby, on behalf of the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka ratify the said Third Protocol Amending the Treaty of Amity and Cooperation in South Asia (TAC) and undertake faithfully to perform and observe all its provisions and to take all such lawful measures as may be necessary to prevent the violation thereof;

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have signed these presents and affixed hereto my seal.

DONE, at Colombo on this Thursday the First day of the Waning Moon of the Month of Medin of the year Two Thousand Five Hundred and Fifty Five of the Buddhist Era (Thursday the Eight day of the Month of March of the Year Two Thousand and Twelve of the Christian Era).
