INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

KNOW YE, that whereas, the *Protocol 6 on Unlimited Fifth Freedom Traffic Rights between ASEAN Capital Cities* was signed on 20 May 2009 in Manila, Philippines;

WHEREAS, Protocol 6 allows the designated airline(s) of each Contracting Party to operate air passenger services from its capital city to the capital cities of the other Contracting Parties and vice versa with full fifth (5th) freedom traffic rights; and

WHEREAS, the Protocol provides that there shall be no limitation on capacity, frequency and aircraft type with regard to air passenger services operated under the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it known that **I, BENIGNO S. AQUINO III**, President of the Republic of the Philippines, after having seen and considered the *Protocol 6 on Unlimited Fifth Freedom Traffic Rights between ASEAN Capital Cities*, do hereby ratify and confirm the same and each and every article and clause thereof.
