WHEREAS the Protocol 3 On Domestic Code-Share Rights Between Points Within The Territory Of Any Other ASEAN Member States (hereinafter referred to as "the Protocol") was signed on 13 October 2017;

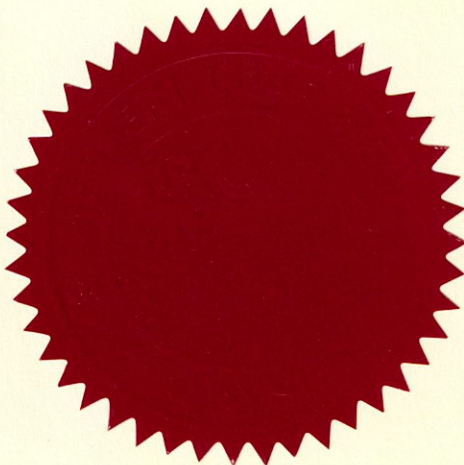
AND WHEREAS the Protocol was signed on behalf of the Government of Malaysia on the same date;

AND WHEREAS Article 4 of the Protocol provides that it shall enter into force on the date of the deposit of the third (3rd) Instrument of Ratification or Acceptance with the Secretary-General of ASEAN and shall become effective only among the Contracting Parties that have ratified or accepted it.

NOW THEREFORE, the Government of Malaysia, having considered the Protocol, ratifies the same and undertakes to perform and carry out faithfully all stipulations therein contained;
