## INSTRUMENT OF ACCESSION

## TO THE ASEAN TRADE IN SERVICES AGREEMENT

WHEREAS the ASEAN Trade in Services Agreement, signed on 07 October 2020, in Manila, Philippines,

WHEREAS the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste, on 04 March 2025, expressed its readiness to accede to the ASEAN Trade in Services Agreement,

**NOW THEREFORE I,** Bendito dos Santos Freitas, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation, declare that the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste, having considered the above-mentioned ASEAN Trade in Services Agreement, accedes to the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out the stipulations therein contained.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, I have signed this Instrument of Accession at Dili, Timor-Leste on 13 November 2025.

## Annex

- In accordance with the ASEAN Trade in Services Agreement (the "Agreement"), the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste shall undertake the following obligations:
  - (a) Article 12 (Transition to Schedules of Non-Conforming Measures), paragraph 1, Timor-Leste shall submit to the ASEAN Secretariat their Schedules of Non-Conforming Measures in Annex I and Annex II in accordance with Article 11 (Non-Conforming Measures) within 13 years after entry into force of the Agreement; and
  - (b) Article 12 (Transition to Schedules of Non-Conforming Measures), paragraph 3, Timor-Leste's Schedules of Non-Conforming Measures in Annexes I and II shall co-exist with their Schedules of Commitments under the AFAS for 15 years after entry into force of the Agreement.
- In accordance with Article 36 (Transitional Arrangement Relating to the AFAS), the AFAS and their schedules of commitments made by Timor-Leste under the AFAS, will remain in force, *mutatis mutandis*, until 15 years after entry into force of the Agreement.
